WHAT THE HECK IS THIS OUTLINE???

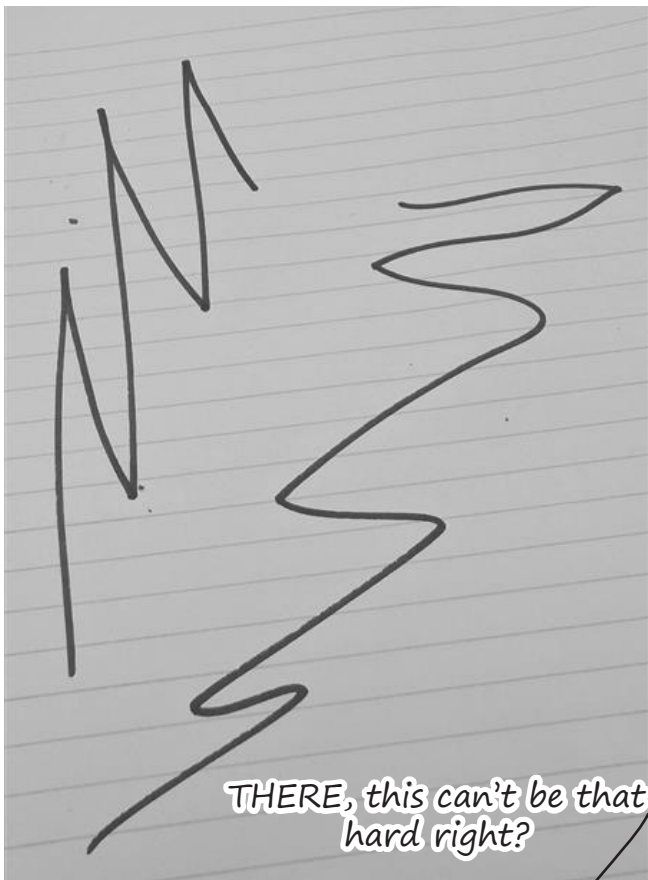
I hate this stupid sharpie...
